 1. Arizona’s Academic Standards Assessment (AASA) – You can find these results by speaking to the teacher and asking for these scores. All teachers were instructed to give the parents/guardians that came to the parent/teacher conference scores for the AASA tests.
 2. SCHOOL CITY-Can parents access this information? - Parents do not have access to SchoolCity. Teachers can give parents the results from the District Benchmark Tests.
 - Requirements for Proficiency 1. Arizona English Language Learner Assessment-Who takes this test? - The AZELLA test is given to any student that has been identified as an ELL students by the Home Language Survey. This survey is given to parents to complete when they register their student for the first time.
 2. Move On When Reading- How are 3rd grade students impacted? - The Move On When Reading (MOWR) policy impacts 3rd grade students by requiring them to reach a proficiency level on the AASA ELA assessment. Students that fall below the proficiency level indicate that the student is reading below the 3rd grade level and must be retained.
 3. Grade Level Benchmarks-What’s a benchmark? - A Grade Level Benchmark test is an assessment that is given to students near the end of each quarter. This assessment is composed of standards that are taught throughout that quarter. The test(s) assess if they student has reached proficiency in that area.
